## WHO WE ARE

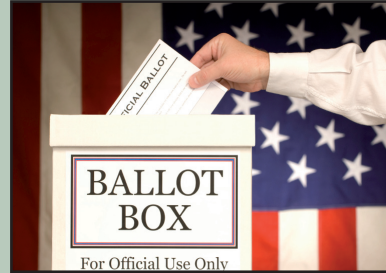


Greensboro Neighborhood Congress is a nonprofit organization of more than 75 neighborhood organizations representing more than 17,000 households throughout the city.

The Greensboro Neighborhood Congress was formed in January 2003. Our purpose is to:

- serve as a forum for mutual understanding and networking across neighborhoods
- address problems faced by neighborhoods
- educate neighborhoods and their leaders
- increase the influence of neighborhoods on municipal decisions, responsiveness, and accountability.

## WHAT WE DO



- Convene monthly meetings of neighborhood organizations
- Introduce monthly programs and forums that provide information and connections that neighborhood leaders can use to improve their communities
- Establish connections between neighborhoods
- Promote educational opportunities for neighborhood leaders
- Provide assistance and support that enables neighborhoods to address specific concerns
- Promote funding opportunities for neighborhood initiatives

## WHAT WE EXPECT



Members of the Greensboro Neighborhood Congress are encouraged to:

- attend regular meetings of the full Congress and enlist in at least one supplementary committee of the Congress
- share what they learn in the Congress with their community and bring those residents' views to the Congress
- participate in Congress events including attending, planning, and executing the events
- offer input in discussions that ultimately lead to establishing and promoting a position on citywide issues
- volunteer expertise to assist other neighborhood leaders.
